TED TALKS WATER RATES PART 1

WHILE I DON'T PERSONALLY SUBSCRIBE TO DEBATING ISSUES ON SOCIAL MEDIA, I SOMETIMES HEAR OF THESE DEBATES AND LEARN OF QUESTIONS THAT COMMUNITY MAY HAVE. RECENTLY THERE WAS A POST ABOUT WATER RATES AND QUESTIONS ABOUT HOW THEY ARE ESTABLISHED AND USED. IT'S A LONGER DISCUSSION THAN I MAY BE ABLE TO COVER IN ONE ARTICLE BUT WILL ATTEMPT TO TRY AND BRIEFLY EXPLAIN THEM OVER THE NEXT COUPLE OF ARTICLES.
A COMMUNITY WATER SYSTEM IS REQUIRED TO PAY FOR ITSELF. IN OTHER WORDS, WE CAN'T USE PROPERTY TAXES TO INSTALL, REPLACE, OR MAINTAIN THE WATER SYSTEM. IT PAYS FOR ITSELF THROUGH THE WATER RATES. THERE ARE TWO PARTS TO THE WATER BILLING, AND EACH IS FOR SEPARATE REASONS. THE FIRST CHARGE WE'LL DISCUSS IS THE 'WATER SYSTEM MAINTENANCE FEE' OR THIS IS ALSO SOMETIMES CALLED A BASE RATE. THIS IS BASE FEE THAT IS CHARGED MONTHLY REGARDLESS OF WATER USE.

THE CAPITAL COSTS TO INSTALL NEW, AND REPLACE AGING WATER INFRASTRUCTURE. IS SEVERAL MILLIONS OF DOLLARS. FOR EXAMPLE, OF THE APPROXIMATELY 17 MILES OF WATER PIPELINES IN THE CITY, A FEW YEARS AGO WE HAD TO REPLACE APPROXIMATELY 4 MILES OF WATER PIPELINES. AND ASSOCIATED APPURTENANCES. THAT WERE OVER 50 YEARS OLD AND FALLING APART. ADDITIONALLY, THE CITY DRILLED AND DEVELOPED A NEW "WELL" SOME YEARS AGO FOR A MORE RELIABLE SOURCE OF WATER FOR THE COMMUNITY. THESE PROJECTS COSTED SEVERAL MILLIONS OF DOLLARS, MOST COMMUNITIES DON'T HAVE THE CASH RESERVES TO FUND LARGE INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS WHEN THEY ARE NEEDED, NOR CAN THEY ALLOW THE WATER SYSTEM TO NOT OPERATE WHILE THEY TRY AND SAVE THE CASH, SO THEY APPLY FOR FUNDING. MOST OFTEN THE FUNDING COMES THROUGH THE STATE AND MUST BE PAID BACK OVER TIME. TO PAY BACK THE FUNDING. THE STATE REQUIRES COMMUNITIES TO ESTABLISH A RELIABLE CONSISTENT BASE CHARGE THAT IS USED TO REPAY THE DEBTS AND INCLUDES A LITTLE EXTRA FOR FUNDS THAT MAY BE NEEDED FOR AN EMERGENCY OR CAN BE APPLIED TO FUTURE REPLACEMENTS. THEY USE A FORMULA TO DETERMINE A COMMUNITY WATER BILL AFFORDABILITY BASED ON THE COMMUNITY DEMOGRAPHICS, SO IT MAY BE DIFFERENT FOR EACH COMMUNITY. THE SIMPLEST ANALOGY I CAN THINK OF IS COMPARING IT TO A HOMEOWNER WHO WANTS TO ENJOY THE BENEFITS OF HAVING A HOME WITHOUT HAVING THE CASH TO PAY FOR IT UP FRONT, SO THEY GET A MORTGAGE TO PAY FOR IT OVER TIME. THE WATER SYSTEM MAINTENANCE FEE IS USED TO REPAY DEBTS AND SAVE A LITTLE FOR EMERGENCY PROJECTS WITHOUT LOSING THE BENEFIT OF HAVING WATER AVAILABLE. THIS FEE IS ATTACHED TO EACH CONNECTION. IF A SINGLE OWNER HAS MORE THAN ONE CONNECTION TO THE WATER SYSTEM (METER), THERE WILL BE A FEE FOR EACH ONE. THIS TYPICALLY APPLIES TO THOSE THAT HAVE MULTIPLE LOTS AND CHOOSE TO KEEP CONNECTIONS AT EACH LOT. NEXT ARTICLE WE'LL TRY AND COVER HOW DEVELOPERS. IMPACT FEES, AND THE WATER USE COSTS CONTRIBUTE TO THE WATER SYSTEM. THERE IS A LOT MORE DETAIL INTO WATER SYSTEM FINANCING AND OPERATION THAN CAN BE DESCRIBED IN AN ARTICLE. AS DISCUSSED ABOVE. WHILE I DON'T PERSONALLY SUBSCRIBE TO SOCIAL MEDIA DEBATING. I DO HAVE AN "OPEN DOOR POLICY" AND AM HAPPY TO DISCUSS ANY TOPICS THAT I HAVE KNOWLEDGE OF WITH COMMUNITY

MEMBERS.

TED MICKELSEN, P.E. PUBLIC WORKS DIRECTOR/FIRE CHIEF WE HAVE HAD SEVERAL CONCERNED CITIZENS COMPLAINTS RECENTLY REGARDING THE FLYING OF DRONES AROUND THE CITY. PLEASE BE AWARE THAT THE CITY CURRENTLY HAS NO ZONING ORDINANCES OR CITY CODE REGARDING THE FLYING OF DRONES. THE STATE AND COUNTY DOES HOWEVER, AND ANY ENFORCEMENT WOULD COME FROM THOSE GOVERNMENTAL ENTITIES.

UNDER GIVEN CONDITIONS, A LICENSE IS REQUIRED FOR ONE FLYING A DRONE, EVEN AS A HOBBIST, WHICH LICENSE IS ISSUED BY THE FAA. ANY QUESTIONS ABOUT LICENSING SHOULD BE DIRECTED TO THAT FEDERAL AGENCY. THE STANDARDS AND REQUIREMENTS FOR FLYING DRONES ARE RATHER COMPLEX, BUT THERE IS MUCH ON LINE ABOUT IT AND ANYONE INTERESTED SHOULD GO ON LINE TO SEE WHAT THE REQUIREMENTS ARE.

SOME OF THE VIOLATIONS CAN OCCUR WHEN FLYING A DRONE OVER PRIVATE PROPERTY WHICH IS NOT YOUR OWN, AS WELL AS THE HEIGHT TO WHICH THE DRONE IS FLOWN. THERE ARE ALSO SOME PROHIBITIONS ALL TOGETHER IF YOU ARE FLYING A DRONE OVER AN AREA WHICH IS ON FIRE.

DON'T BE STUPID ABOUT IT. YOU CAN BE ARRESTED FOR DOING SO AS WELL AS BEING PROSECUTED CRIMINALLY. ILLEGAL DRONE FLYING IS NOT TO BE TREATED LIGHTLY AND YOU SHOULD BE AWARE OF ALL OF THE REGULATIONS THAT PERTAIN TO THIS ACTIVITY.
